

MPH in Health Management & Policy Academic Year 2011-2012

The health management and policy concentration is designed to prepare students with competencies needed for careers in policy development, policy analysis and health management. The curriculum addresses health systems, quantitative methods, health economics and finance, managed care, private and public sector management, state and national policy, and health law. The concentration provides instruction in professional competencies commonly found in schools of public policy, public administration, business and management. Students in the health management and policy concentration will complete a minimum of 48 semester credit hours to earn the MPH degree. By the conclusion of the MPH program, a student in the health management and policy concentration will be able to:

1. Identify the main components and issues of the organization, financing and delivery of health services and public health systems in the US.
2. Describe the legal and ethical bases for public health and health services.
3. Discuss the policy process for improving the health status of populations.
4. Apply the principles of program planning, development, budgeting, management and evaluation in organizational and community initiatives.
5. Apply quality and performance improvement concepts to address organizational performance issues.
