## UNTHSC School of Public Health MPH – Public Health Leadership Concentration

The Master of Public Health in **Public Health Leadership** is a 48-semester credit hour program designed to transform students into the public health leaders of tomorrow. Whether pursuing public health work in a governmental, non-governmental, for-profit or non-profit capacity, our graduates will be equipped with a skillset that will enable them to emerge as prominent leaders in the field. The Public Health Leadership concentration will equip graduates with a set of interdisciplinary skills to tackle issues at the heart of community and population health. Students will also learn to critically think about health disparities and health equity during their time in the program, and learn how to apply their knowledge in practical ways to advance the health status of local communities and beyond.

Students in the Public Health Leadership concentration are admitted once a year as a cohort. Full-time enrollment is required and students are expected to graduate in five consecutive semesters. Students follow a weekly calendar of activity that occupies 9-hour blocks of time, Monday to Friday (9am-6pm).
